At 7:00 PM, Mayor Wood called the meeting to order. The following members were recorded as present: Brown, Fields, Peterson, Peet, and Nickerson. Mayor Wood stated that Chair Pro Tem Miles would appear later.

<u>MAGIC Presentation – Myra Miles, Management & Government Information</u> <u>Center</u>

Myra Miles gave a presentation on MAGIC, a specialized department within Prince William Public Libraries, that provides services for local businesses and non-profits.

Town Manager's Report – Tangela Innis, Town Manager

Tangela Innis provided her report. Mayor Wood informed the Town Manager of

the complaints that he has received and the town's ability to track them. He also requested an update on the town's public access channels not being viewable in our community. Town Manager Innis informed the Council that Staff has been in discussion with GoGov that will allow citizens to submit complaints and track the progress of staff. GoGov will provide a presentation to Council at the September 5, 2023 meeting. She noted that staff continues to work with TSI, Verizon, and Comcast to resolve the public access channel issue.

Introduction of Employees – Tangela Innis, Town Manager

Tangela Innis announced Amanda Carballo was promoted to Deputy Town Clerk. Four Youth Interns were hired starting July 31, 2023, a part-time Human Resources Administrator with a start date of August 14, 2023, and the Chief Financial Officer. She informed Council that three candidates were interviewed for the Director of Planning and Community Development position. In addition, she stated that the Chief Financial Officer will conduct interviews for the Senior Accountant position. She introduced the Deputy Town Clerk, Chief Financial Officer, and three of the Youth Interns.

<u>Establishing Members of the Naming Committee – Councilman Shaun Peet</u>

After discussion from the members of the Town Council, on a motion made by Councilman Peet, seconded by Councilman Brown, to amend the Naming Policy to withdraw the Naming Committee. Vote 5-2-0 (Yes: Peet, Fields, Peterson, Brown, Nickerson, and Peet; No: Miles and Wood; Abstain: N/A).

Vice Mayor Nickerson suggested that the Town Council accept the Town Manager's proposal for an amended policy for naming and re-naming Town facilities, parks, and streets. The Town Manager will update the policy, create a way for staff to receive notifications, and for staff to bring recommendations to the council for a vote.

Vice Mayor Nickerson asked the Town Attorney to explain the difference between "procedure" and "policy." She asked if what will be adopted is an amended policy or just having a discussion on the procedure moving forward. The Town Attorney informed the Vice Mayor it was both: amending the policy, to change a portion of the procedure. The Town Attorney advised that they do not have to call it a policy.

After discussion from the members of the Town Council, on a motion made by Vice Mayor Nickerson, seconded by Councilman Peet, to accept the Town Manager's proposal for an amended policy for naming and re-naming Town facilities, parks, and streets. Vote 7-0-0 (Yes: Fields, Peterson, Peet, Brown, Miles, Nickerson, and Wood; No: N/A; Abstain: N/A).

Discussion of Strategic Planning Meeting and Scheduling of Dates

The Strategic Planning Meeting is scheduled for August 26, 2023. The lobbyist will speak for about 90 minutes. The meeting will be held from 8:30 AM until 5:00 PM. The Council discussed whether one day is enough time. The Council, by unanimous decision, decided to schedule the meeting for a day and a half. Councilman Peet informed Council that he would prefer the meeting be held in Dumfries. Councilman Brown agreed, but stated he would go with the majority. Councilwoman Peterson preferred the meeting be held in Dumfries as well. The remaining Council (Miles, Nickerson, Fields, and Wood) voted for the meeting to be held away from Dumfries.

Mayor Wood excused himself from the discussion of this agenda item.

On a motion made by Councilman Fields, seconded by Chair Pro Tem Miles to direct Town Staff to bring before a Public Hearing along with the Planning Commission on the same date to amend the Town Code Section 70-22. Vote 3-2-1 (Yes: Fields, Peterson, Brown; No: Nickerson and Peet; Abstain: Miles).

On a motion made by Councilman Brown, seconded by Vice Mayor Nickerson to reconsider the vote. Vote 6-0-0 (Yes: Brown, Fields, Miles, Peterson, Peet, and Nickerson; No: N/A; Abstain: N/A).

After discussion by the members of the Town Council, on a motion made by Councilman Fields, seconded by Councilman Peet, to amend the agenda to create an action item to amend the code for a discussion and to waive the 30-day rule. Vote 4-2-0 (Yes: Brown, Fields, Miles, and Peterson; No: Peet and Nickerson; Abstain: N/A).

On a motion made by Councilman Fields directing the Director of Planning and Community Development to review the Town Code for the September 5th Meeting. Vote 1-5-0 (Yes: Fields No: Brown, Miles, Peet, Peterson, and Nickerson; Abstain: N/A).


STAFF RECOMMENDATION

BACKGROUND

Conditional Use Permit Standard of Review

As outlined in Section 70-10 of the Town Zoning Ordinance, "Conditional Use Permits may be granted by the Town Council for any of the uses for which a CUP is required by the Zoning Ordinance. In granting any such CUP, the Council may impose any such conditions in connection therewith as will assure that the use(s) will conform with the requirements contained herein and will continue to do so and may require a guarantee or bond to insure the conditions imposed are being and will continue to be complied with.

A CUP shall not be issued unless the Council shall find that:

The proposal as submitted or as modified will not affect adversely the health, safety, or welfare of persons residing or working in the neighborhood of the proposed use; and will not be detrimental to public welfare or injurious to the property or improvements in the neighborhood. - A. Request This request from Winners Church is to operate an assembly hall at 17877,17863, and 17845 Old Triangle Road. As stated in the submitted application, the space will be multifunctional and provide the applicant an opportunity to expand their current programming and community outreach initiatives. An assembly hall is defined as a building or part of a building in which facilities are provided for such purposes as meetings for civic, educational, political, religious, or social activities.
- B. Site Location The site is located south of the intersection of Old Triangle Road and Graham Park Road. The site is approximately 2.2 acres in size, with an 11,000 square foot office building located on site.

- C. Comprehensive Plan The Graham/Fraley Small Area Plan and Future Land Use Map have these three properties designated as Commercial Uses. The zoning of the properties is B-1, General Business District, with Assembly Halls being permitted through a Conditional Use Permit in this district. Based on this information, the proposed use does conform with the Comprehensive Plan.
- D. Parking Requirements- Based on the Town Code, the proposed use requires fifty-two parking spaces. The table below shows the breakdown for the required spaces. There are currently fifty-seven striped spaces, with the ability to accommodate ten more striped spaces in the future.

WHEREAS, at its September 5, 2023, meeting, the Town Council discussed Chapter 70 (Zoning), Article I and V, of the Town Code, regarding whether to update the nonconforming signs and highway realignment or condemnation to sections to comply with Code of Virginia §33.2-1230; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council wants to consider this proposed amendment; and

WHEREAS, Sec. 70-646 (a) of the Town Code gives Town Council the authority to adopt amendments to the Zoning Ordinance by ordinance whenever the public necessity, convenience, general welfare, or good zoning practice require; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council desires the Planning Commission to review and make recommendations on these proposed amendments to Chapter 70, Article I and V, of the Town Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Council of the Town of Dumfries does hereby initiate the appended amendments to Chapter 70, Article I and V, of the Town Code that would:

1. Allow a legal nonconforming, lawfully erected billboard sign which is impacted by the use of the power of eminent domain may be relocated by its owner to another location as close as practicable to the same property

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO ZONING ORDINANCE

Sec. 70-14. - Signs

* * * *

- (k) Nonconforming signs.
 - 1. Signs, other than outdoor advertising signs, which do not conform to the regulations and restrictions prescribed for the zoning district in which they are situated, but which were erected in accordance with all applicable regulations in effect at the time of their erection may remain erected only so long as the then existing use which they advertise or identify remains.
 - 2. No nonconforming sign shall be worded so as to advertise or identify any use other than that in effect at the time it became a nonconforming sign; however, signs designed for and used to display changeable messages may continue to be used for that purpose.
 - 3. No nonconforming sign shall be moved on the same lot nor to another lot unless the moving will relocate the sign into a zoning district or an area in which it will conform.
 - 4. No nonconforming sign shall be altered except in conformity with the provisions of this section. If damaged to an extent greater than 50 percent of its replacement value, it shall not be rebuilt.
 - 5. Any sign which is not in conformity with the provisions of this section, and which is not or ceases to be a lawful, nonconforming sign, shall be subject to removal under the provisions of subsection (m) of thie section.

[New]

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing nonconforming signs provisions, pursuant to Code of Virginia §33.2-1230, a legal nonconforming, lawfully erected billboard sign which is impacted by the use of the power of eminent domain may be relocated by its owner to another location as close as practicable to the same property and in accordance with the provisions of said statute. The owner shall make application for Town approval in this regard. Said relocated billboard sign will remain nonconforming notwithstanding a new location.

* * * *

Sec. 70-582. - Highway realignment or condemnation.

- (a) Any lot which, by reason of realignment of a public street or highway or by reason of condemnation proceedings, has been reduced in size to an area less than that required by law or ordinance, shall be considered a nonconforming lot of record subject to the provisions set forth in this section; and any lawful use or structure existing at the time of such highway realignment or condemnation proceedings which would thereafter no longer be permitted under the terms of this chapter shall be considered a nonconforming use or structure as that term is used in this chapter.
- (b) Pursuant to Code of Virginia §33.2-1230 and Sec. 70-14(k) of this ordinance, a legal nonconforming, lawfully erected billboard sign which is impacted by the use of the power of eminent domain may be relocated by its owner to another location as close as practicable to the same property and in accordance with the provisions of said statute. The owner shall make application for Town approval in this regard. Said relocated billboard sign will remain nonconforming notwithstanding a new location.

Sec. 2-58. Background checks.

- (a) Pursuant to Code of Virginia §§ 15.2-1505.1, 15.2-1505.3, 19.2-389 and other relevant statutes, the Town Council adopts this ordinance to enable the Town Manager or designee, in the interest of public welfare and safety, to require fingerprinting and access state and national criminal history record information regarding applicants for Town employment and volunteers, when permitted by law, as set forth in this section. The Town Manager or designee shall determine the type and scope of the criminal history record checks and any other background checks required for the affected positions.
- (b) The Town Manager or designee shall require a criminal history record information investigation on all applicants for positions in the Police Department. Applicants shall include those for initial hire and those current employees who laterally transfer, promote, or demote to such a position, and volunteers as permitted by law.
- (c) In addition to subsection (b) applicants, the Town Manager or designee shall require a criminal history record information investigation for finalists identified in the personnel selection process for all applicants, including volunteers as permitted by law, in all departments that report to the Town Manager and for all positions that report to the Town Council. Applicants shall include finalists for initial hire and those current employees who laterally transfer, promote, or demote to such a position, and volunteers as permitted by law.
- (d) The Town Manager or designee may require a periodic criminal history record information investigation and other background checks, and determine their type and scope, for current employees and volunteers when authorized by federal or state law.
- (e) Any applicant, employee, or volunteer described in this ordinance shall, if required, submit to fingerprinting, and provide personal descriptive information and any other necessary paperwork to be forwarded along with the fingerprints through the Virginia State Police Central Criminal Records Exchange to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for the purpose of obtaining state and national criminal history record information regarding such applicant, employee, or volunteer.

The Town Manager shall have the ability to suspend or remove any and all Town employees, except those indicated in Section 2-80 and Section 2-83 of the Town Code and the Town Charter, subject to applicable personnel policy and grievance procedures.

Should the Council amend the Town Code or Charter, the applicable provisions of this Agreement shall be amended accordingly.
