Town Council Meeting April 2, 2013

During the month of February 2013, there were a total of 398 calls for service in the Town of Dumfries and 326 (82%) of them were handled by the Dumfries Police Department. In addition, Dumfries officers made a total of 202 traffic stops resulting in 124 traffic citations and 11 criminal arrests. There were 24 parking citations issued.

During the month of February no juveniles were arrested.

On March 1<sup>st</sup> staff attended a career day held at River Oaks Elementary School.

On March 5<sup>th</sup> staff attended the Williamstown Home Owners Association meeting and was available to answer any questions or concerns that might have been brought up.

On March 6<sup>th</sup>, a local Girl Scout Troop was scheduled to visit the police station for a tour. They cancelled due to the snow event that day and we will re-schedule.

March 10<sup>th</sup>, staff attended the re-opening of the new Baylor's Ice Cream stand at Main Street and Curtis Drive.

March 13<sup>th</sup>, a local Cub Scout group toured the police station and met with staff.

March 23<sup>th</sup>, staff was on hand to assist at Ginn Park for the annual Easter Egg Hunt.

March 25-28, 2013, Officer Renee Moody attended School Resource Officer training.

The Police Department continues to address the goals and objectives it has established for 2012/2013.

Goal 1: Build Stronger Neighborhood and Business Programs with Emphasis on Participation and Cooperation between Citizens and Community Groups.

- During the month of March, 16 hours of foot patrols were conducted in the Town.

Goal 2: Increase the Safety of Motorists and Pedestrians within the Town.

- Officers spent time conducting radar at various locations. This month they maintained high visibility in the area along Old Triangle Road and Main Street.

- Officers responded to 82% of the calls for service in the Town.
- Officers attended several refresher courses held here at the station and in Chesterfield.
