RE: Police Department Monthly Report
Town Council Meeting June 4, 2013

During the month of April 2013, there were a total of 463 calls for service in the Town of Dumfries and 353 (77%) of them were handled by the Dumfries Police Department. In addition, Dumfries officers made a total of 217 traffic stops resulting in 76 traffic citations and 16 criminal arrests. There were 13 parking citations issued.

During the month of April, there was one juvenile arrest for possession of marijuana.

On April 26th staff attended training on Illicit Tobacco: Trafficking Patterns & Organized Crime in Fairfax sponsored by the National White Collar Crime Center. Information obtained from the training has been shared with staff.

On May 1st staff conducted a tour/talk for a local Girl Scout group at the police station.

On May 4th staff was on hand and participated in the Multicultural Festival held at Garrison Park.

On May 9th staff attended Officer Lopez's graduation from the Rappahannock Regional Criminal Justice Academy.

On May 11th staff conducted foot patrols at the Charter Day event held at Merchants Park.

On May 16th staff attended the Law Enforcement Memorial Service at the Rappahannock Regional Criminal Justice Academy.

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The Police Department continues to address the goals and objectives it has established for 2012/2013.

Goal 1: Build Stronger Neighborhood and Business Programs with Emphasis on Participation and Cooperation between Citizens and Community Groups.

- During the month of March, 27.15 hours of foot patrols were conducted in the Town.
- During the month of March, officers made personal contact with residents and businesses in their assigned communities.

Goal 2: Increase the Safety of Motorists and Pedestrians within the Town.

- Officers spent time conducting radar at various locations. This month they maintained high visibility in the area along Old Triangle Road and Main Street.

Goal 3: Maintain a professional and effective Police Department responsive to the needs of the Department.

- Officers responded to 77% of the calls for service in the Town.
- Officers attended several refresher courses held here at the station and at the academy.
