Subject: Public Works activities for the Month of May 2012

STORMWATER

Public Works attended the EPA Region 3 Compliance Conference, Prince William County Chesapeake Bay Watershed Improvement Plan Public Meeting, and Virginia Water Monitoring Council 2012 Conference. Gained much information on upcoming Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) requirements, reference sources for our MS4 program, and contacts and information for planning and implementing a comprehensive monitoring program for Quantico Creek.

We are waiting for the students at Rippon Middle School to receive administrative authorization to begin bacteria monitoring for Quantico Creek. We expect the bacteria monitoring should begin within the next few months.

Public Works continued with our field inspections as part of a comprehensive inspection of our storm water management system.

Street sweeping and litter control was done throughout the Town this month. These efforts reduce the amount of trash and debris that end up in Quantico Creek and its tributaries.

PLAN REVIEW/PERMITS

The Department reviewed multiple building plans, site plans, and grading plans for pending construction.

Public Works performed 16 Occupancy Permit inspections this month.

Work has started on the McDonalds in the Triangle Shopping Center. The Old Port Restaurant has been demolished, the site is secured and the contractor is on a 90 day schedule to have the restaurant opened.

The Grace Church on Williamstown Drive is under construction and positive progress is being made. The church intends on being open by this fall.

We are actively working on the review of a flood plain study to the First Town Center project.

Much effort was spent this month developing blight and nuisance Notices of Violation. The basic wording of NOV's is now established, and NOV's can be issued in a more timely response

to violation inspections. We currently have 8 outstanding violations and many additional violations are pending.

Northern Virginia Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan is being reviewed in preparation for submittal to Council for approval.

TRANSPORTATION/ROADS

Tripoli Boulevard Drainage Improvement Project - Right of way acquisition is underway. Public Works staff will notify council via email as to progress with regard to the right of way efforts and additional progress with regard to the advertisement date.

Main Street Intersection Project – The surveying for the project is substantially complete and the conceptual design of the intersection project is underway.

Public Works is working on the negotiation of the Multi-Modal Phase II scope and fee.

MEETINGS ATTENDED

Multiple meetings with developers, contractors, town consultants and meetings on other town related matters were attended this month.

A Memorandum of Understanding with Prince William Soil & Water Conservation District (PWSWCD) was approved by Council. This will allow PWSWCD to provide erosion and sediment control (ESC) inspections and supplemental ESC plan review for sitework in the town.
