




Partnership Recap

- Focus areas for retail include General Merchandise, Restaurants, Home and Garden (Hardware), and Health and Medicine
- Real estate focus has been centered around The Rose Gaming Resort along Jefferson Davis Highway and Dumfries Road





















































- Fast Casual Restaurant 1 We had a call with the real estate manager, and they named Dumfries as a market of interest. We are currently working to find the right site.
- Fitness Center 1 We had a call with their Franchise Director and RE manager. They signed a franchisee for the area and like the market. The criteria for the site needs to be 2nd generation, in a grocery/DG/Goodwill anchored type center. They prefer to be located for convenience and near residential. We are currently working to find them a site that fits.
- Fast Casual Restaurant 2 We had a call with their Director of Real Estate. They shared that their Virginia expansion strategy is in full force and will look at any markets that could fit their criteria. The ideal location needs to be 2,000-2,500 SF, but this is flexible. End cap lot preferred and at least 20,000 VPD. They go for grocery-anchored centers and do not have contenancy requirements.
- Convenience Store 1 We need to find a site that works for their model, but they are interested in the market overall.
- Quick Service Chicken Restaurant 1 We followed up with the real estate manager. They got us in touch with their area franchisee, who shared that there is still interest in this market. Working together on finding a site that works for them. They prefer to purchase over lease.
- Convenience Store 2 We had a call with their Virginia expansion team. They are rapidly growing and want to take another look at this market.
- Quick Service Restaurant 2 There is currently no franchisee for the area, but they said they would be in touch once that changes.
- Fitness Center 2 They do not currently have a franchisee for this market but will let us know once that changes.
- Retail Strategies is in constant communication with the following other retailers as they continue to review market opportunities: (3) Health and Medicine Clinics, (2) Hardware/Home and Garden Stores, (1) Boutique Fitness Studio, and (12) Restaurants

Retail Strategies represented Dumfries, Virginia at ICSC Las Vegas

• There are ~2,400 retailers that registered to attend the show. Our job was to market Dumfries to these retailers and connect them with available land and existing real estate.

What we heard from Retailers at ICSC Las Vegas

- Family Dollar is optimistic in their Virginia expansion plans and is rolling out a new prototype with a complete redesign.
- Firehouse is in expansion mode in the state, but it is all dependent on getting franchisees, so if there are any individuals in the community who have the means and the interest to do so, let us know and we can connect you to the real estate manager.
- **Odoba** has over 740 locations and is looking to expand along the east coast.
- Veterinary Emergency Group is a 24/7 emergency vet clinic. They are currently growing in the Virginia market.
- Tropical Smoothie Café is actively seeking franchisees in Virginia.
- Planet Fitness Expressed interest in the market and Northern VA as a whole. Would go inline in an existing center or in a stand-alone building.


