

Dumfries Has Gone Green

After a long delay due to COVID and delayed construction, the Town's Department of Public Works is pleased to present our new "Green Restroom" facility in Ginn Memorial Park. The facility was delivered via flatbed truck from the manufacturing plant in Pennsylvania, installed on May 26th and officially opened on June 18th, 2022.

Designed by Greenflush Technologies in Washougal, Washington, the bathroom maximizes water and energy conservation by using solar panels to power LED lights and rainwater collection to an underground vault for flushing. The entire unit cost was as much as one sewer connection, saving the Town money while still providing a clean, no odor, environmentally friending facility in an urbanized area. Above Average Hurricane Season Predicted for 2022: Are You Ready?

The 2022 Atlantic hurricane season officially started on June 1 and will run until Nov. 30. In the Eastern Pacific Ocean, hurricane season begins on May 15 and ends on Nov. 30, according to the National Weather Service. Forecasters are calling for an above-average hurricane season this year, which could mean 2022 might be the seventh above-average season in a row. NOAA's forecast calls for 14 to 21 named storms with winds of 39 mph or higher.

"Hurricane Ida spanned nine states, demonstrating that anyone can be in the direct path of a hurricane and in danger from the remnants of a storm system," said FEMA Administrator Deanne Criswell. "It's important for everyone to understand their risk and take proactive steps to get ready now by visiting Ready.gov and Listo.gov for preparedness tips, and by downloading the FEMA App to make sure you are receiving emergency alerts in realtime."

Know Your Hurricane Risk - Hurricanes are not just a coastal problem. Find out how rain, wind, water, and even tornadoes could happen far inland from where a hurricane or tropical storm makes landfall. Start preparing now. Here are a few steps to get ready.

- •Prepare an Emergency Plan Make sure everyone in your household knows and understands your hurricane plans. Ensure your business has a continuity plan to continue operating when disaster strikes.
- •Know your Evacuation Zone You may have to evacuate quickly due to a hurricane if you live in an evacuation zone. Learn your evacuation routes, practice with your household and pets, and identify where you will stay.
- Recognize Warnings and Alerts Have several ways to receive alerts. Download the FEMA app and receive real-time alerts from the National Weather Service for up to five locations nationwide. Sign up for Code Red and be aware of local notifications for emergencies.
- The Elderly and Those with Disabilities Identify if you may need additional help during an emergency if you or anyone else in your household is an individual with a disability. Check with neighbors, senior adults, or those who may need additional help securing hurricane plans to see how you can be of assistance to others.
- •Review Important Documents Make sure your insurance policies and personal documents, such as ID, are up to date. Make copies and keep them in a secure password-protected digital space.
- •Strengthen your Home & Get Tech Ready De-clutter drains and gutters, bring in outside furniture and consider hurricane shutters. Keep your cell phone charged when you know a hurricane is in the forecast and purchase backup charging devices to power electronics.
- •Gather Supplies Have enough supplies for your household, including medication, disinfectant supplies, and pet supplies in your go-bag or car trunk. You may not have access to these supplies for days or even weeks after a hurricane.



Budget documents must be rated "proficient" in all four categories, and in the 14 mandatory criteria within those categories, to receive the award.
