CodeRED is an important to tool to help keep you informed and prepared for any emergencies that may occur in our area. Officials will send messages to alert you of emergency details, instructions, or precautions that you need to make well-informed decisions and remain safe. This system is precise enough to geotarget residents within an exact area of impact so that only those people who are affected by emergency situation are noticed.

The CodeRED® system will be used to send critical communications, from evacuation notices to missing child alerts.


RAD Program in Dumfries

What would you do if you faced a violent or other dangerous situation? Would you run? Would you comply with your attacker's demands? Would you defend yourself? Rape Aggression Defense (R.A.D.) is fundamental, hands-on training that teaches women how to protect themselves in the event of an attack. It combines classroom instruction on awareness, prevention, risk reduction, avoidance, and basic hands-on defense tactics. Certified deputy RAD instructors teach the course. No two situations are the same, but you CAN develop a plan to help you survive an attack. After all, YOU are the one who is ultimately responsible for your personal safety.

The Rape Aggression Defense (R.A.D.) Basic Physical Defense Program for Women is a 12-hour course offered exclusively to women and young women. A variety of topics are covered, with an emphasis on the "4 Risks of Personal Safety", physical defense techniques, and responsibility in decision-making/ The techniques are practical self-defense tactics, easy to learn and use, make you more aware of awareness and avoidance strategies to reduce your risk of attack.

The sessions are scheduled to start on March 22, 2023, with meetings on March 25 (Saturday), March 28, and March 31 to conclude the session. We will meet from 5-8 PM each night except for March 25, 2023. On March 25, 2023, we will meet from 10 AM-1 PM. Please check your schedules and ensure you can attend ALL four instructional nights. Dress comfortably and wear tennis shoes and feel free to bring snacks and any non-alcoholic beverage to the facility. The class will take place at the Community Center located at 3800 Graham Park Rd. in the Town of Dumfries.






Dumfries Market on Main - New Location, New Vibe

Flood Awareness Week - March 12 - 18, 2023

Flood Awareness Week, March 12-18, 2023, is a time to inform all Virginians about flood risk and the importance of flood insurance. Anywhere it can rain, it can flood. Flooding can happen anytime, and the Town of Dumfries wants to ensure you and your family is prepared. You can't control the weather, but you can prepare for it. FEMA and the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) encourage all Dumfries residents to purchase flood insurance today to protect their homes and families before local flood risks occur. Policies typically take up to 30 days to go into effect.

Here are three things to know about flooding: • Just one inch of water in an average-sized home can cause more than \$25,000 in damage: In 2017, the average flood claim payment was more than \$90,000. • Flooding can happen anywhere, not just in high-risk areas: More than 25% of flood insurance claims come from outside the high-risk flood area. • Most homeowners insurance doesn't cover flood damage: With a flood policy from the NFIP, you're covered—up to \$250,000 for your home and \$100,000 for belongings. Please feel free to contact NFIP with questions or to learn more about the right level of coverage for your home or business.
